OFF THE TRACK

A special exhibition in the Albula railway museum

Glide by ship through Graubünden's mountains to Genoa? Travel in luxury aboard the Engadine Oriental Railway across Graubünden to India? What about a quick ride on the rail-bike down to the next village for a beer after work?

Such fantastic ideas, visionary projects and impulsive activities are the subject of the special exhibition «Off the Track». Here you can learn how ships might once have been hoisted over the Alps and you can view the original plans of the Engadine Oriental Railway. And here against the impressive backdrop of the Palü Glacier - you can take a seat on a rail-bike.

In addition, you can discover how avalanches used to be blown up with Swiss Army mortars or why cows used to travel by the dozen, and even what rail passengers forget or lose on their journeys.

Cold feet?

In 1899 the railway transported 1000 tons of ice from Davos to Landquart. From there the ice, for cooling food and drinks, was sent all the way to France. It was mined from the frozen Davos Lake - where cold feet were one of the perils of the job.



Fancy more?

It's not just about ice and winter: the new special exhibition at the Albula Railway Museum has information about the fantastic, the visionary, the distant, the weird, the fauna and the mislaid.

DISCOVER

Attractions in the museum

- Clà Ferrovia children's tour: A special path around the permanent exhibition takes children to several points. At the museum cash desk the young discoverers get a children's booklet to validate a special ticket at the tour.
- Visit our **display depot** in the basement showing over 650 articles from the RhB's day-to-day work.
- -The **Edmondson ticket printer** from earlier RhB days is also on display in the depot.

Model Railway Workshop

The Model Railway Workshop displays wonderfully detailed models of the RhB's buildings, viaducts and tunnels as they were in the 1950's and 60's in 0m gauge. The display is designed as a workshop. Its builder, Bernhard Tarnutzer, is regularly on-site and happy to provide information about the creation of the installation. Demonstration times are given in the museum (normally from 3.00 pm). You can also experience a virtual journey around the model railway from a model footplate.

Tip for model railway fans

There is a second model railway in the local Town Museum on a scale of 1:87 made by the Albula-Railway-Club. It is a replica of the RhB line between Bergün and Preda. Combination tickets (valid on different days) are available at the Museum's cash desk.
